Background information

LEINET is the Lesotho Environmental Information Network formed in 1995 under the auspices of the International Environmental Information Exchange Network (INFOTERRA). The Information and Documentation Centre of the Institute of Education at the National University of Lesotho was designated as the INFOTERRA NationalFocal Point (NFP) forLesotho.

INFOTERRA has established regional information networks that help provide solutions to common environmental problems facing a group of nations. Thus the Southern African Sub-regional INFOTERRA Network (SASIN) was established as a model for future unity programs. SASIN comprises 11 Southern African countries (Angola, Botswana, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Swaziland, Tanzania, Zambia and Zimbabwe) and is linked closely with the SouthernAfricanDevelopmentCommunity (SADC).

SASIN too recommended the establishment of National Environmental Information Networks (EINETs) to serve as fora for promotion and exchange of environmental information at national levels. Consequentially, the Lesotho

LESOTHO NATIONAL DATABASE (LND)

The Irish INFOTERRA National Focal Point provides free database software known as 'Q&A' for distribution by the Lesotho INFOTERRA NFP to all members of the Network who collect, organize and disseminate environmental information. Training is also provided for the operation of the software. The database has about 45 members, which include among others, the Institute of Education at NUL, Lesotho Highlands Development Authority, Lesotho Highlands Water Commission, Department of Energy, National Environment Secretariat, Ministry of Planning and Economic Affairs, Southern African Development Community (SADC), Environment and Land Management Sector (Maseru), Masianokena Environmental Centre, Lesotho Council of NGOs, Lesotho National Library Serivce,

Seminars

LEINET holds seminars in Maseru or at N.U.L. Roma to raise environmental public awareness.

At these seminars, different presenters are requested to come and share information on environmental matters, and anybody is free to present any environmental information they have. During the seminars, announcements are made on on-going and up-coming activities. Thus, members are kept abreast of what is going on in the country within the field of the environment.
